# PFPD UPDATE

The Pigeon Forge Police Department would like to remind you that driving safely in winter weather can be challenging for even the most experienced driver. It's easy to forget after months of mild conditions that snow and ice demand careful driving and special preparation for your vehicle.

We ask you to drive slowly and be prepared in the event of a crash or if your

vehicle breaks down. Always keep an emergency kit in the vehicle. Any of us can get caught out in the elements and we need to make sure our vehicles are well stocked to help get us out of trouble or to keep us safe until help arrives. Keep blankets, flashlights, jumper cables, and flares or emergency lights in your vehicle. Even if you don't need them, they can be used to help someone else in need on the road.

# PFFD UPDATE

While winter in the Smokies is beautiful, the need to heat our homes can bring safety issues to Pigeon Forge residents. Here are some tips to stay safe this season.

- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet from heating equipment (furnace, fireplace, wood stove or portable space heater).
- Have a three-foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your kitchen stove to heat your home.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room; ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container and keep that container a safe distance from your home.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month.
- If you need smoke alarms for your home call the fire department at 865-429-7381 (non-emergency).

# PIGEON FORGE SCRAPBOOK



In the mid-twentieth century, most households could not afford one vehicle much less the two or three that some families now own. There were few modes of transportation other than walking or a bicycle, especially in a rural area. This made the ALCOA Work Bus an affordable, convenient way for Pigeon Forge and Sevierville residents to get to their jobs

at the plant. The bus would stop at several pick-up points in Pigeon Forge then in Sevierville. Even if you were not an employee of the plant, you could go between Pigeon Forge and Sevierville for a quarter a ride.

# **COMMUNITY CENTER UPDATE**
