SEVIERVILLE, Tenn.— Due to recent rainfall, combined with higher levels of humidity the burn ban which is implemented earlier this week by Sevier County, the Cities of Gatlinburg, Pigeon Forge, and Sevierville, and the Town of Pittman Center will be lifted at 8 a.m. on Friday, March 7.

The lifting of the burn ban will allow recreational burning, including fire pits, campfires and charcoal grills. For updates on Burn Permits please visit www.burnsafetn.org, or contact your local Fire Department.

The rainfall received this week has been enough to help diminish the high fire risk that was affecting all areas in Sevier County earlier this week.
